

SBA Rule Variations

Article 9 d) Crease Violation Rule

Effect: Negative creates new area for officials to have to concentrate on and slows the game by adding more stoppages.

Article 23 a) The Broom: Shaved brooms are permissible as long as not deemed dangerous by the official.

Effect: None/this states the same as CBF in the fact that the official has the call on the dangerous equipment shaved or otherwise.

Article 28 c) Helmet equipment: minor penalty if player with helmet lost participates in play minor penalty.

Effect: none/this is a ineligible player in CBF still minor penalty.

Article 30 Int 30 Team captain or assistants must be present on the ice to request rule interpretation.

Effect: none/covered under CBF later in the rules under stoppages, time outs and measurements.

Article 43: Time Outs: who may call them and how they work.

Effect: none/duplication of rules.

Article 45 b) CBF team must have 11 players SBA team must have 6 registered players at the beginning of an event tournament or provincial.

Effect: none/your tournament committee can rule on this or your league decides this.

Article 47: Initial Line Up- Mixed only

Effect: none/this is a league make up and is in the constitution of the league.

Article 49: Overtime (midget and bantam categories only)

Effect: this is a league issue doesn't need to be a rule.

Article 50 Int 50 Protest filing procedures

Effect: none/should be in constitution or tournament rules.

Article 52: Goals interpretation of a legal goal.

Effect: none/duplicated throughout other sections of CBF rules. Example goaltender interference covers a broom in the crease.

Article 56: Accepted Pass states that a goalie may still hand pass when not in contact with the crease.

Effect: none/once a goaltender leaves the crease by CBF he is now treated as a player for hand pass purposes.

Article 58 Int 58 Officials should determine if the player's stance is giving him an illegal advantage.

Effect: this rule interpretation is not allowed because the simple fact is if you are crouched or otherwise positioned but in all aspects legal it is not in the officials power to deem it illegal.

Article 60 Int 60 Face Off execution

Effect: this should be in an officials tech manual not the rule book.

Article 61 Int 61 Regulations Determining Face-Off locations: rule 3 contradicts rule C) on simultaneous penalties where the face off should be C) states it is in the end the ball was in and 3 states it is in the 2nd players defending zone as he caused the stoppage.

Effect(s): there are slight variations here but not conformity of a decision.

Article 62 Off Side at the centre red line: Added d) SBA intention definition is shot at goalie or player intentionally touches the ball after officials warning.

Effect: this rule should be added to the CBF as it clarifies intent.

Article 63 Int 63 5 points of icing are procedural 5 is written incorrectly as it should state if a player catches up to the ball on an icing but refuses to play it icing is waved off.

Effect: good clarification should go in CBF

Article 66 Int 66 Dropped broom

Effect: none/this is covered later under thrown broom or 2 brooms areas.

Article 67 Int 67 Refusing to play the ball

Effect: further clarification as to what constitutes refusing CBF should add this area.

Article 68 Int 68 Refusing to progress the ball

Effect: further clarification to what is progressing the ball and how an official should react when it is not being done. CBF should look at this area.

Article 69 Ball unplayable or off the rink surface

Effect: CBF should look at this rule as it states the idea of imaginary boundaries for rafters in rinks with a low roof.

Article 74 Broomball Contact Higher than the Shoulders

Effect: SBA minor penalty CBF stoppage and face-off. Both rules work but for safety factor the penalty could be discretionary.

Article 76 Int 76 Types of penalties: explanation of penalties that go into overtime.

Effect: none that is already covered under overtime rules.

Article 77 Int 77 Penalties Explains bench minor and team bench minors.

Effect: none this is also explained under unsportsmanlike conduct.

Article 80 Int 80 Simultaneous Minor 3 minors constitutes a major but that major does not count towards the number of majors a player may get in the game.

Effect: As an official I think this is a bad rule if you get 3 minors in one stoppage then a major later you should be ejected you are a danger to other players.

Article 81 Int 81: Match Penalties

Effect: this can be in the policy manual not need in rules about sanctioned games

Article 91 Int 91: Penalty Shot explanation of what warrants a penalty shot.

Effect: None this is already explained under the individual penalties Example Tripping.

Article 93 Int 93 Game Awarded By Decision score of these games are 5-0

Effect: once again this can be covered in constitution by leagues

Article 94 Int 94 Penalty Procedures examples

Effect: covered under procedures of penalties.

Article 95 Int 95c) Arbitration Mistake face off where the ball was at the time of the whistle

Effect: centre ice in CBF makes more sense as an official you do not know what was about to happen example if defending team was about to break out you punish them by a face off.

Article 99 Forbidden Stop (Midget and Bantam)

Effect: none they can be explained in league rules.

Article 100 Forbidden Freezing of the Ball

Effect: none this is explained in delay of game and other rules for CBF.

Article 101 Goaltender in Offensive Territory

Effect: SBA goalie may cross centre as long as he doesn't participate in play in CBF may only cross if going for a substitution.

Article 102 Delay of Game added a rule of poking stick through the net is not allowed Minor Penalty

Effect: no effect on game

Article 105 Leaving the Team Bench or Penalty Bench

Effect: both are explained in different areas in CBF.

Article 106 Int 106 Equipment Verification

Effect: none CBF Covers this in other areas under individual areas.

Article 107 Int 107 Illegal and Dangerous Equipment Procedures

Effect: this is procedural and such belongs in the procedures manuals.

Article 115 Int 115 Throwing an Object explains the rules of an object

Effect: clarification CBF could look at using this as clarification.

Article 124 b) Hand Check from Behind Minor Penalty

Effect: this is a good penalty as it adds another area to enforce the contact from behind CBF should look into this.

Article 129 Int 129 Roughing the procedure for determining a level of intent and violence.

Effect: this should be done always if the official has any doubts confer with the other official.

Article 130 Int 130 Fighting Sucker punch added as intent to injure

Effect: should be moved to the examples of intent to injure.

Article 142 (no Hit Categories) explanation of incidental contact and how as an official you determine it

Effect: should move to procedural manual.
