



PROTOCOL FOR POSITIVE COVID-19 TEST WITHIN A CLUB AND/OR MINI LEAGUE GROUP

Clubs/Mini Leagues will designate a COVID-19 representative who will be responsible for keeping the contact tracing logs and providing information to Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) for contact tracing purpose only. This individual will be identified by the club/mini league and could be the Coach, President, Manager or other responsible person trusted with confidential information. This individual will need to have on hand a copy of daily attendance with athlete, coach/staff names, phone numbers and email addresses.

Guidance on procedures to follow:

- A. If a participant exhibits symptoms of COVID 19/or is a close contact of a COVID 19 case.**
- Participant must immediately self isolate, contact the Health Authority, and inform member organization's COVID representative.
 - Participant remains in isolation.
 - If the participant is negative, then they must follow the Public Health's guidance and will only return to Broomball when cleared to do so.
- B. When an athlete, coach or volunteer is notified by SHA that they have tested positive for COVID-19 the athlete, coach or volunteer will:**
- Participant will continue to self-isolate and follow all SHA instructions.
 - Provide SHA with the Club's/Mini Leagues COVID-19 representative's name and number to assist with club related contact tracing.
 - Advise your Clubs/Mini Leagues COVID-19 Representative.
 - Only return to club activities as per SHA and club/mini league instructions (i.e.: symptom free and a negative test result).
- C. While waiting to hear from SHA, the COVID-19 representative will:**
- Notify the Saskatchewan Broomball Association
 - Advise, at minimum those training/competing in the same club/group/mini league that an individual received a positive test result (*note: Use the term "an individual", to protect the identity of the positive case*).
 - Advise that this training group/club/mini league will refrain from in-person training for 48 hours or until contacted by SHA/Public Health (*based on communication Sask Broomball received from SHA*).
 - Ensure the other team/club/mini league members are self-monitoring more closely and that any other athletes, coaches, or volunteers, experiencing symptoms will be required to stay home and contact 811 for further guidance. (Advising the whole club is a good idea, as it may help limit gossip and maintains open transparent communication).
- D. Once SHA contacts the Club's COVID-19 representative, the representative will:**
- Follow all instructions provided by SHA (Sask Health determines who is a close contact and advises the COVID-19 representative of the process to follow).
 - Ensure the training group/club/mini league and the rest of the broomball club follow all additional prevention/control measures issued by Sask Health Authority.
 - Update Saskatchewan Broomball Association

E. All athletes, coaches or volunteers that are notified by SHA as a close contact or non-close contact of someone having tested positive for COVID-19 will:

- Follow all instructions provided by SHA
- Advise your Club/Mini League COVID-19 Representative

F. Return to Broomball activities after a positive case or close contact:

- The individual who tested positive for COVID 19 can return to broomball activities after 14 days of being symptom free, and with direction from 811 and the SHA.
- The team/mini league with the individual who tested positive must self monitor for 14 days before resuming broomball activities.
- The other teams/individuals in the same mini-league, who in the last 48 hours, did not play against or practice with the individual who tested positive will be allowed to resume practice/competition.
